The PhD research focused on the reading ability of children with and without dyslexia and teachers' various classroom activities, teaching methods and tools. The aim was to understand students' learning process and the difficulties associated with reading in Arabic. Significantly, in a further action-based phase, results from this examination were used to help teachers in developing and adjusting their educational practices with correspondence to their students' needs and the nature of the taught subject and its various cognitive skills. In order to achieve that, a range of methods and research tools and interventions were utilized including; testing, classroom observation, interview, document and curriculum analysis.
